**Profile** : Jane Fowles is a chartered Landscape Architect, Urban Designer and Managing Director of Novell Tullett. Jane's particular expertise is in urban landscape, the masterplanning, design and regeneration of complex inner city areas, where her facility for urban and landscape design can be used in tandem.

Jane has been project leader with responsibility for the management of a wide range of schemes within both rural and urban environments, including landscape design and implementation, historic research/evaluation and landscape/townscape assessment. Past projects have included design and implementation of a variety of large scale schemes; including university campuses, the preparation of lottery bids for funding, restoration and integration of new development within historic landscapes; assessment, evaluation and enhancement of riverine landscapes particularly in inner city areas; design and implementation of schools landscape and landscape assessments, particularly in relation to planing assessments.

**Selected Projects** : **URBAN AND LANDSCAPE DESIGN**

→ Saw Close, Bath

A sensitive location not built on since Roman times, with heritage issues being a World Heritage Site, Scheduled Ancient Monument and Conservation Area surrounded by listed buildings in the heart of Bath. Accommodating the considerable fall across the site in a simple and flexible scheme which uses contemporary but respectful detailing. On site 2015.

→ Keynsham Town Centre

Our challenge here was to design a scheme which could create a new heart for Keynsham and unite the disparate areas of the town. By carving out room for a leafy market square, the design was able to renew the missing civic space and connect the new shops and library with the existing High Street. We have also improved and delineated pedestrian access to encourage more shoppers and visitors. Planted steps and ramps that traverse a substantial drop in levels to link the new quarter to the park and river below.

→ 5 Islands School, St Mary's

The design and implementation of a through school for pupils from 3-16 years. Scilly is designated AONB and Conservation Area, and the proposed school will be the biggest construction project the island has ever witnessed. Because of the landscape significance of the island an ES was prepared by the team and managed by Jane. Landscape proposals are designed to fit with the grain of the wider landscape.

→ Cabot Circus, Bristol

The design and development of the public realm for a £500 million, mixed use, inner city redevelopment scheme in Bristol. The project completed 2008, includes three main shopping streets connected to the existing NT refurbished shopping centre; two civic squares, one in context of a Scheduled Ancient Monument and Listed Building; a residential street and home

→ St Ursula's Academy, Bristol

Development of proposals for a 3-form entry school on the site of an existing convent school within a sensitive protected landscape. Proposals to safeguard the mature trees on site included designing a new shared space entrance around an existing oak tree. Working with the contractor's team we helped progress the scheme to planning submission.

→ Milford Dock, Milford Haven

The comprehensive regeneration of Milford Dock to provide a hotel, pub and restaurant, new marina and chandlery facilities, a food store, new residential districts, a new footbridge, public open space, new routes and connections to the town and railway station. Our submission for planning included the strategy for public spaces; an arts strategy and design of sustainable solutions to parking.

## **LANDSCAPE AND TOWNSCAPE ASSESSMENT:**

→ AONB Assessments

Assessment of a series of Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty for the Countryside Commission including Suffolk Coasts and Heaths; Shropshire Hills and Cranbourne Chase and the West Wiltshire Downs. The studies included identification of wide ranging characteristics which classify the landscape as AONB and threats to the perpetuation of the landscape character types.

→ Surrey Towns

Four studies on the landscape of the urban fringe carried out for Surrey Country Council. The approaches and arrival to each town was assessed, its relationship with the surrounding countryside and capacity of existing fringe areas to absorb further development.

## **RESIDENTIAL DEVELOPMENT**

→ Hardington Moor, Yeovil

LVIA and landscape proposals for the redevelopment of a brownfield site in a sensitive rural environment. The scheme included affordable and market housing in a small community with high visibility within the surrounding area. Retaining trees and protecting ecology to increase the sense of place was paramount.

→ Grahame Park, Colindale, LB Barnet

Major redevelopment of mixed affordable and market housing to 1970s site in Greater London. Design of all external areas, public open space, streets and building frontages throughout the scheme.

→ Picket Twenty, Andover

Masterplanning, urban and landscape design for MDA urban extension on green-field site in Hampshire. Planning application for 1000 houses, community centre and school, supported by environmental statement, included the major ecological studies to nearby ancient woodland.

→ Felsted, Essex

Masterplanning and design for 850 houses within substantial landscape framework, on a brown field site. Production of a design guides for urban and landscape design. The construction of first housing phases coincided with implementation of landscape buffers and advanced planting works.
